

1. TEXTBOOK

A) Ensure you have one!
B) Do all the activities thoroughly: make a note of vocabulary & grammar points as you go along.
C) Learn the vocabulary you note down and use it regularly.

2. SPECIFICATION A) Find and download the

A) Find and download the specification from AQA or Edexcel. B) Look and make notes on what exams you have & what they include. C) Check speaking & writing mark schemes and note down requirements. Add these elements each time you speak/write.

3. GRAMMAR

A) Boring! However, vital for top grades - e.g. passive, subjunctive 1 & 2.
B) Make notes on grammar points in text book, complete activities thoroughly and get feedback.
C) Use a workbook to practise these further & brush up on GCSE grammar.

5. VOCAB LEARNING

A) All exams require good vocabulary knowledge.

- B) Note down all new vocab from reading activities, translations, listening activities and the film/book as you go along.
- C) Learn this topic related vocab on Quizlet or Anki as you go along. Revisit the older vocabulary each term.
 - D) Practice using it at every opportunity throughout the course.

<u>4. ESSAY WRITING</u>

- A) Know the book/film/play inside out.
 B) Ensure you can write about characters/sub characters in detail.
- C) Ensure you can write about main themes and sub-themes in detail.
- D) Have a quote for each theme/sub-theme, main/sub-characters and learn.
 - E) Use a film/literature revision guide.

F) Answer past essay questions & get feedback.

6. HONE EXAM TECHNIQUE

A) Speak to your teacher about the best way to approach each exam paper for you. Apply these tactics and practice. Adapt as necessary.
B) Check out YouTube A-Level German Exam Technique videos for additional ideas.

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7. PAST PAPERS

A) Complete all past papers available online at AQA or Edexcel websites under: A-Level German.
B) Mark and check answers against mark scheme. Make notes of improvements & apply to future work.
C) Check transcript from listening papers and learn new vocab.
D) EXTRA: Try out past papers from the other exam boards too!

9. LISTENING PRACTICE

A) Do all listening practice provided in your course and look at the transcripts once done to note & learn new vocab.
B) Complete more extensive listening practice online at the Deutsche Welle website, Easy German, Coffee Break German and Slow German. Access transcripts where possible.
C) Avoid passive listening. Try the listening activities mentioned here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?

8. EXAMINERS' REPORTS

A) Once you've completed a past paper, read the examiners' reports from it.
B) Access them at the AQA and Edexcel (or equivalent) websites under: Examiners Reports.

10. FACTS & FIGURES

A) As you go through the course, note down facts and figures per subtopic related to German speaking countries. To provide specific evidence to back up any points you make.
